

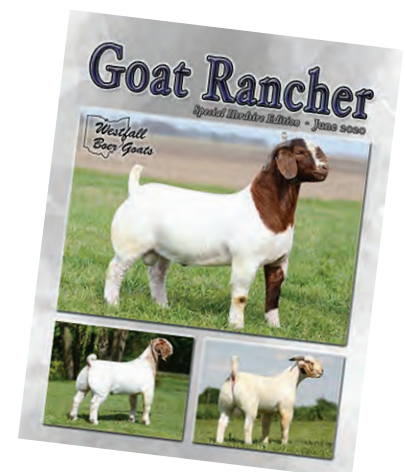

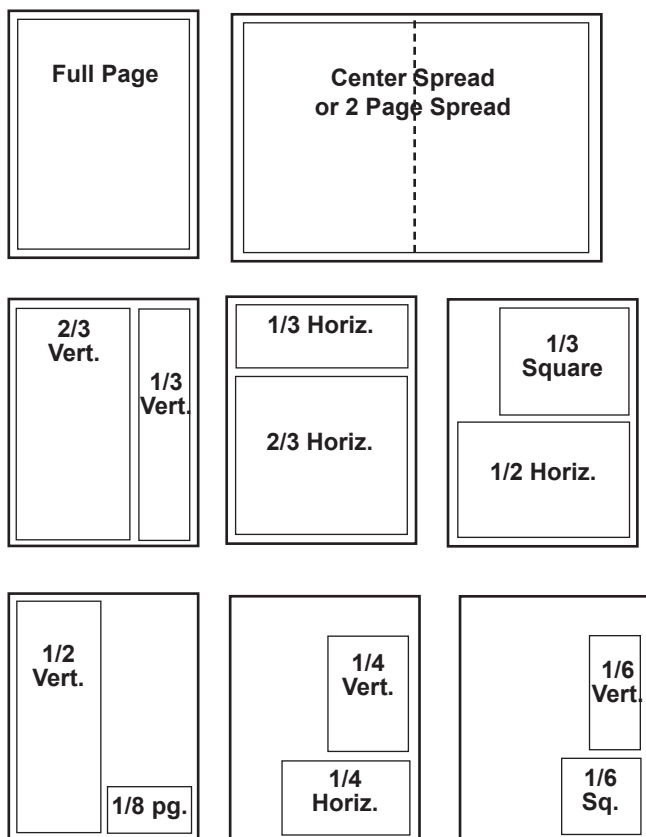

GENERAL INFORMATION

Deadlines: Space reservation by the 5th of the month prior to the month of publication. Advertising materials are due by the 10th of the month prior to the month of publication.

Publication dates: Published monthly. Issue printed on or about the 18th of each month. Issue to be mailed on or about the 26th of month prior to issue date; mailed periodical mail. Goat Rancher does not guarantee delivery by the U.S. Post Office by any specific date. When scheduling time-sensitive advertising, allow approximately two weeks for complete, nationwide coverage. On-line version available on or about the first day of the month of publication.

Rates: NET (non-commissionable)

Terms: Prepayments accepted, otherwise to be invoiced upon publication of issue containing insertion. Due upon receipt. Billing information to be provided by advertiser upon placement of advertising; including, but not limited to liable party, mailing address, purchase order number (if required), tear sheet requirements. Overdue accounts placed on a pre-payment basis only. Finance charges of 2% per month on unpaid balances may be applied to accounts over 90 days.

Cancellation: Insertion orders may be cancelled at request of advertiser with no liability if received prior to the display advertising deadline for the issue in question (generally the 10th of month prior to month of publication). If ad materials are not received by deadline, publisher may repeat most recent advertisement or publish nothing. Advertiser will be invoiced for space reserved.
